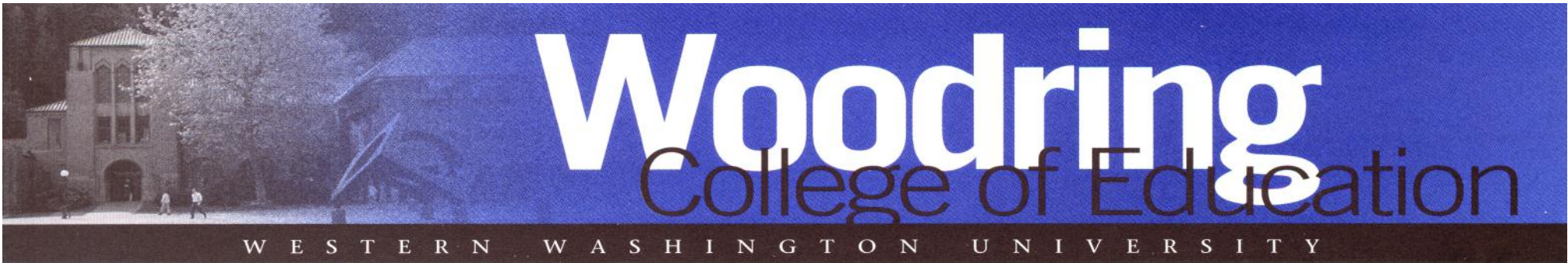
Woodring College of Education fosters community relationships and a culture of learning that advances knowledge, embraces diversity and promotes social justice.
